Main Street Project Update

The new poles are set and the conduits have been put in the ground so the lines can drawn across the street and out of sight. Spectrum has completed most of their work and once the phone company schedules their part, the old



poles can be taken down. This year's work is scheduled to be complete by May 31, including putting the next layer of pavement down to bring the street 1" from the final height. Still to do: Landscaping, surface paving (fall), finishing the parking lot at the north end of the street (wiring the e/v charger), the pop out park and the triangle park at the end of the street.

Recycling is Back!

You can bring your recyclables to the DPW depot on Sargeant Drive again. One container will be for cardboards and the other for plastics and all other recyclables. Our containers will be sent to Casella's facility in Old Town and then to Lewiston for sorting and shipping.

Other news from Tony Smith

The town will be leasing a new sidewalk plow and has ordered a new dump truck (estimated delivery, spring 2023). The town is working with A Climate to Thrive on their climate action plan. One action item is to move towards electric vehicles for the town's fleet. As the technology is not quite affordable for the larger vehicles, replacement will go in waves, with the smaller vehicles being replaced first. Included in the plan is the cost of hiring and or retraining mechanics to work on electric vehicles and to install charging stations at the DPW depot.

Tax Assessment is in progress

The notices of new values will be going out in June so that homeowners will have the opportunity to meet with the tax assessor for clarification and to review the valuations, before the new tax bills go out in July. New valuations are based on the real estate market and given the current one the assessor expects most sectors will see an increase. Another variable that is taken into account during assessments is the town budget. The town budget this year includes a sizeable increase as we must address the issue of fire department and the ambulance/ EMT service. The infrastructure costs will be covered with a bond but hiring 8 full time employees with salaries and benefits is included in the town budget.
